Tax Bill Payment Options

The payment options below are available through January 31, 2023. After January 31, 2023, property tax payments must be made to Racine County Treasurer's Office. If you would like your payment recorded in 2022, it will need to be in the drop box or postmarked prior to January 1, 2023. First installment of tax payments are due by January 31, 2023. In-Person at the Village Offices

By check, cash, or credit card (processing fee applies). We ask that tax payments are made between the hours of 8:30 a.m. and 4:00 p.m. Please note the limited hours around the holidays listed further below.

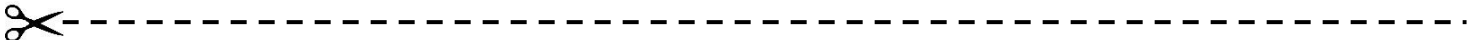

Overpayments

In accordance with the Wisconsin Department of Revenue procedures no cash refunds will be issued at the time the taxes are paid. Checks will be issued for all refund payments (please allow up to 30 days). The refund payments will be issued in the name of all property owners on the check. For example, if the escrow check is made payable to John Smith AND Jane Doe, the refund check will be made payable to John Smith AND Jane Doe.

Annual Dog and Cat Licenses

Dog and Cat Licenses are required in the Village of Union Grove and need to be renewed in January of each year. Cats are required to be licensed even if they are kept in the house. To obtain a license please submit the form below with payment and a copy of current rabies vaccination(s) in person or by mail to Village Office, 925 15th Ave., Union Grove, WI 53182. **(SEPARATE CHECK IF MAILING WITH THE TAX BILL)**. *Also include a stamped, self-addressed envelope for the return of the license and tag.* Any renewal not received by March 31st will be assessed a \$10.00 late fee per animal.

Check Your Lottery Credit!

The Lottery Credit is shown on the tax bill. The credit applies to properties used as a primary residence as of January 1, 2022. If you have not received a lottery credit and believe that you qualify, contact the Village Office by January 31, 2022, to file for the credit. After that date you must contact the Department of Revenue.

What is the levy increase funding?

The Village is facing large increases to its operational costs for the 2023 budget year. The Village prides itself on providing a high level of service to its residents. To continue doing so, the Village needed to increase its Levy for 2023. Below is a chart showing the breakdown of where those levy increase dollars are going.
